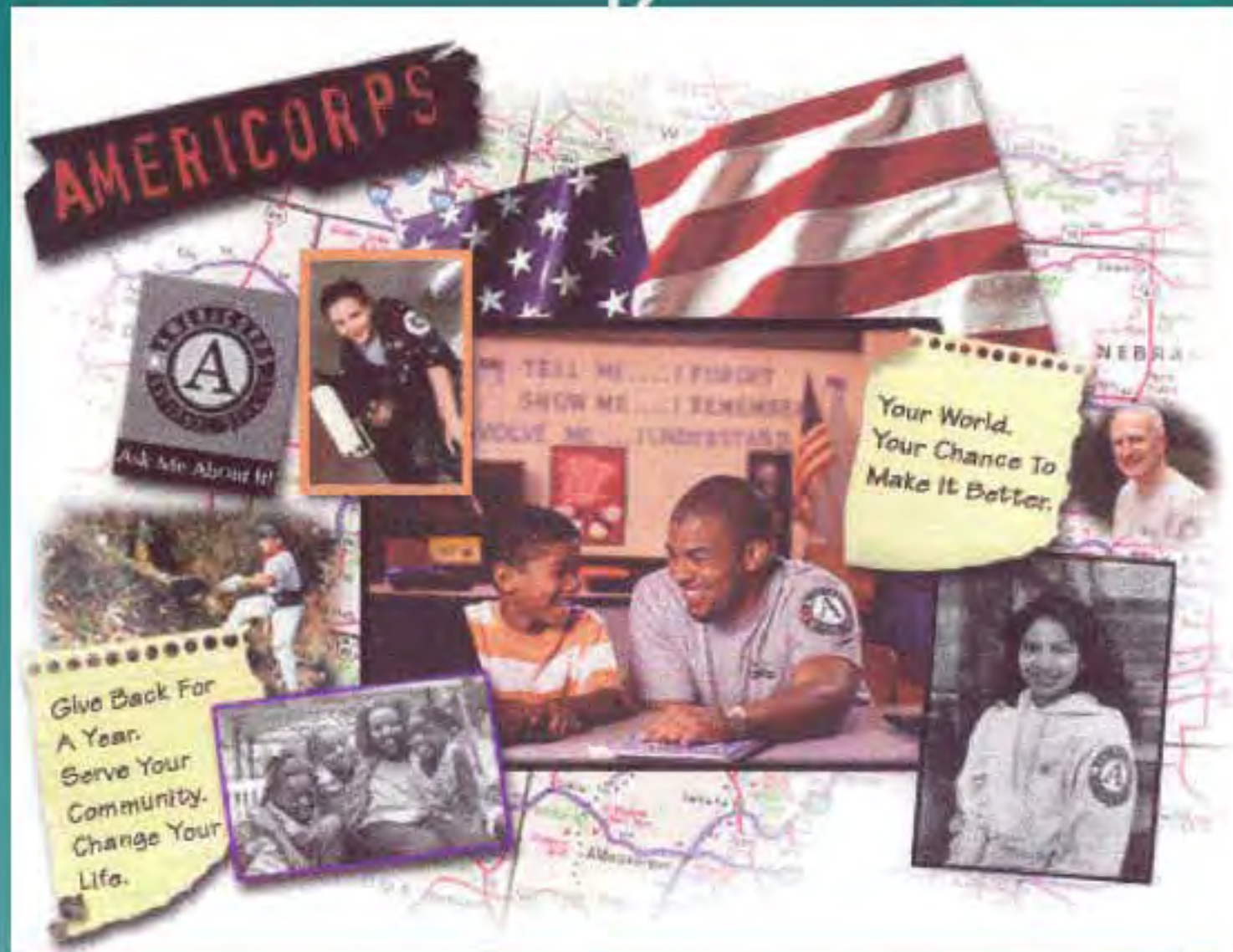

What is AmeriCorps ?

A network of national service programs that engage more than 50,000 Americans each year in intensive service to meet critical needs in education, public safety, health, and the environment.

AmeriCorps:

AmeriCorps members recruit, train and supervise community volunteers, tutor and mentor youth, build affordable housing, teach computer skills, clean parks and streams, run after school programs, and help communities respond to disasters among many other activities.
