### **Tucson to Celebrate National NeighborWoods Month**

**Tucson, Ariz.** – Trees for Tucson, in cooperation with Tucson Electric Power, Habitat for Humanity, today announced that they will celebrate National NeighborWoods Month by hosting 1,000 Trees for Tucson- a project to bring thousands of volunteers of all ages together to plant 1,000 desert-adapted shade trees-, as well as a series of invasive removal projects. These events are some of more than 200 greening, educational, and training efforts throughout the country being promoted during October as part of NeighborWoods Month. NeighborWoods Month is a national campaign of the Alliance for Community Trees (ACT). Trees for Tucson is a member of ACT's NeighborWoods Network.

"It's great to be focusing on the health and livability benefits of trees at a time when other organizations are doing so as well," said Joan Lionetti, Executive Director of Trees for Tucson. "Part of our goal is to draw attention to the good work being done at the grassroots level all across the country to improve urban and community forests."
