- 2 SEC. 70 __. (a) In addition to amounts made available
- 3 by this title, there shall be made available—
- 4 (1) for “Operation of the National Park Sys-
- 5 tem”, \$142,000,000;

1 (2) for “National Park Service Construction”,
2 \$811,000,000;

3 (3) for “Historic Preservation Fund”,
4 \$45,000,000;

5 (4) for “Land Acquisition and State Assist-
6 ance”, \$100,000,000 to be derived from the land
7 and water conservation fund established under sec-
8 tion 2 of the Land and Water Conservation Fund
9 Act of 1965 (16 U.S.C. 460l-5) to provide financial
10 assistance to States in accordance with section 6 of
11 that Act (16 U.S.C. 460l-8), subject to subsection
12 (b);

13 (5) for “United States Fish and Wildlife Serv-
14 ice Resource Management”, \$110,000,000;

15 (6) for “United States Fish and Wildlife Serv-
16 ice Construction”, \$15,000,000;

17 (7) for “State and Tribal Wildlife Grants”,
18 \$50,000,000 for wildlife conservation grants to
19 States and to the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico,
20 Guam, the United States Virgin Islands, the North-
21 ern Mariana Islands, American Samoa, and federally
22 recognized Indian tribes under the Fish and Wildlife
23 Act of 1956 (16 U.S.C. 742a et seq.) and the Fish
24 and Wildlife Coordination Act (16 U.S.C. 661 et
25 seq.) for the development and implementation of

1 programs for the benefit of wildlife and wildlife habi-
2 tat, including species that are not hunted or fished;

3 (8) for “Bureau of Land Management Manage-
4 ment of Lands and Resources”, \$350,000,000;

5 (9) for “Bureau of Land Management Wildland
6 Fire Management”, \$20,000,000;

7 (10) for “Forest Service Capital Improvement
8 and Maintenance”, \$50,000,000;

9 (11) for “Forest Service Wildland Fire Manage-
10 ment”, \$850,000,000, of which \$250,000,000 shall
11 be available for work on State and private land; and

12 (12) for “Bureau of Indian Affairs Oper-
13 ations”, \$15,000,000.

14 (b) Amounts made available under subsection (a)(4)
15 shall not be used for land acquisition.

16 (c) Amounts made available under subsection (a)—

17 (1) shall remain available until September 30,
18 2010; and

19 (2) are designated as an emergency require-
20 ment and necessary to meet emergency needs pursu-
21 ant to section 204(a) of S. Con. Res. 21 (110th
22 Congress) and section 301(b)(2) of S. Con. Res. 70
23 (110th Congress), the concurrent resolutions on the
24 budget for fiscal years 2008 and 2009.

1 (d) Amounts made available by this title for “Forest
2 Service Capital Improvement and Maintenance” may be—

3 (1) used for reconstruction, improvement, de-
4 commissioning, and maintenance of roads, trails,
5 bridges, and dams; and

6 (2) transferred to the “National Forest Sys-
7 tem” account and other appropriate accounts of the
8 Forest Service.

9 (e) Amounts made available by this title for “Forest
10 Service Wildland Fire Management” may be—

11 (1) used for forest, rangeland, and watershed
12 rehabilitation and restoration activities; and

13 (2) transferred to the “National Forest Sys-
14 tem” account, the “State and Private Forestry” ac-
15 count, and other appropriate accounts of the Forest
16 Service.
